
For the first time ever, the girl's season opener will be on the road against the Onaway Cardinals. This will be the first time the teams faced each other prior to the tournament.

There will be a total of nine home games this year and a total of eleven Away games. Most of the games roughly start around 5:30pm with people working concessions.


